### **Tuesday – Matt Brown (Plymouth)**

#### The Way - illuminated by contrast

*In Acts early believers are identified as followers of 'the way'. Do we still identify as this and how do we know? Which way is the right way and how do we know? Chasing the theme through scripture from Genesis to Revelation we will show how God uses contrast to illuminate the way. We will look at how the way is often not a path, destination, action or outcome but a mindset and one that should contrast with those around us who are following their own way.*

### **Wednesday – Philemon Burney (Walsall)**

#### Strengthening one another in God

*"Jonathan...strengthened David's hand in God." What does this mean? How did he do it?*

*In this session we'll look at some incidents in the lives of several faithful people from across scripture who strengthened others in God. We'll examine their actions and discuss how these principles can be applied in our lives today.*

#### The Andrew Effect

*A character study on the disciple Andrew. Looking at the moment Andrew arrives, especially in the gospel of John. An encouraging exhortation for how everyone can contribute however small we feel it may be. The Andrew effect is bringing people to Jesus which transforms their lives in the most powerful way.*

The long lasting impact of COVID on our community

COVID changed our world - nothing has been the same since, and likely will never be the same again. Although Lockdown no longer constrains our movements, social and ecclesial lives, COVID's impact and legacy remains. Everyone was affected, to a greater or lesser degree, but some have been impacted significantly, the effects of which we are only beginning to see. Our young people missed years of school and socialising, youth weekends and camps; brethren and sisters lost out on vital in-person fellowship and company. In this session we will look at what the lasting impacts of COVID are on our community and explore what we are likely to see over the coming years.
